When kids have the right gear, they can have fun along with a well needed quick break outside, even when it's a little chilly out.






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GRADE LEVEL HIGHLIGHT: MUSIC

The Music Program is up and running full blast at Ridge View Elementary. In Kindergarten we are exploring steady beat and singing on pitch through movement songs, simple instruments and singing games. In first grade we just wrapped our Thanksgiving Mini-Musical "A Time to Give Thanks" which was a hit for both the performers and audience. We will now concentrate on foundational music concepts. Second grade has been playing Orff instruments and learning games to reinforce foundational music concepts. Ms. Tuso's second grade class was chosen to star in the Beverly Taylor Sorenson Arts Learning Program Promotional Film that will be used to promote arts in schools with state representatives, stake holders and principals. Ridge View was the school chosen to represent the Music Arm of the Arts! Third grade is hard at work mastering their technique on Orff instruments as we transition to starting to read music on the treble clef staff. The fourth grade is concentrating on learning to play soprano recorders and will beain work on their upcoming Mini-Musical celebrating the great state of UTAH to be presented in February. Fifth grade is polishing their musical "The Elves" Impersonator" (A Holiday Mini-Musical) they will present on Friday, December 13th. Sixth grade has been studying Finale from William Tell Overture with instruments. We then used colored flashlights to paint the Finale with light. It was like our own personal light show in the music room! In December, the entire school will take part in the first annual Ridge View Holiday Sing Along with a live band. It is an honor to teach each of your children music each week. I believe the unity we experience through music we create will positively impact the culture of our school. Thank you for all of your support of the music program. We are learning and creating memories that will last a lifetime.
