School Attendance Matters

As we welcome warmer weather and longer hours of daylight, it's a great time to remind everyone of the importance of school attendance. Did you know research shows that missing just two days of school per month can negatively impact academic progress? While it is possible to make up the missing work, it is much more difficult to make up the instruction that takes place when a student is absent. Attendance habits established kindergarten through 2nd grade have lasting effects on students throughout their education. Children with high attendance in the early grades continue to have good attendance; and students with low attendance in the early grades are more likely to have low attendance—and lower academic performance. As your child's most influential teacher, we ask for your support in helping your child get to school on time every day. We understand that some absences are unavoidable due to illness or family challenges. Please let the school know if your family needs assistance dealing with such challenges.

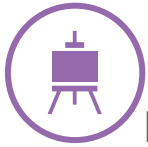
