  - Introduced members and distributed agenda
- School LAND Trust Plan
  - $\circ$   $\;$  Review Mid-Year Acadience Data and Progress
    - Focus is on students making typical or better growth goal for next year will be the same
    - Looking for an increase of 5%
    - Will need to have 12.8% growth to meet end-of-year goal for 2023-2024 year
      - What do we attribute the growth to?
        - Different skills, Walk to Read groups, interventions, other supports helping students progress
        - Fine tuning reading skills based on WTR data
  - School LAND Trust & TSSA Plan for 2024-2025
    - Goal is still focused on typical or better progress
    - We are following the state goal 60% of students in K-3 will make typical or better progress using middle-of-year and end-of-year data from Walk to Read (95% group) and Acadience
    - Current data is K-6, next year we will be K-3 so data will look different
    - Reviewed Action Plan Steps for LAND Trust budget
      - Majority of finances will be spent on personnel (Teachers, Aides, Specialists, Interventions Assistants, Rotations, BTS program)
      - Legislative changes for BTS grant have modified funding
        - There will now be a uniform distribution every school will get the same amount
        - Budget is based on previous calculations anticipating Ridge View will be allocated .50 FTE - we are still hoping enrollment will be taken into account
    - Funding Changes
      - Additional Walk-to-Read materials / other intervention resources

- Pay for substitutes as needed for teachers to participate in professional development / tutoring and/or creating learning scales and common formative assessments
- Potential technology purchases
- Next year we anticipate changing rotations back to once weekly for each class for each rotation
  - Kristen Helton, Sabrina Horsely, and Shantelle Stark voiced specific support for this plan
- No changes were suggested to the LAND Trust Plan
  - Sabrina Horsely motioned to approve, Jaron Halford seconded
  - All in attendance voted in favor of this plan
- TSSA Plan
  - Part of funding is used for rotations
  - Majority will go toward Instructional Coach position
    - Next year there will not be a need for two coaches 50% of Instructional Coach salary is paid through TSSA plan, balance paid by Jordan District
- Agenda Item from previous meeting: Wit & Wisdom (New reading program being implemented)
  - Implementation timeline by grade level
    - All teachers have either gone through, or are currently going through the training
    - This school year some teachers are only doing Module Zero, other teams are using a larger portion of the program
    - Instructional coaches have noted increased student engagement, more student discussions, more critical thinking skills, and increased higher-order questioning
  - Questions about participation
    - Sabrina Horsely brought up concerns of other parents
      - What are parent options for opting out of modules or certain texts that are being provided? Some parents do not want their student(s) to read a particular text. What alternatives could be provided?
        - All books/texts used are on the Jordan District Approved Book List
        - Ms. Doleac will reach out to Jordan District Teaching and Learning Department - Carolynn Gough
