Meeting Notes:

- Land Trust Review/Feedback
 - Land Trust money pays for Walk to Read assistants, Mrs. Helton (music teacher), and Taylor Wright (physical education teacher)
 - Feedback on adding a licensed physical education teacher is positive
 - Rotation schedule has been adjusted due to increased student population and to better meet the needs of the school and community
 - Land trust is tied to tier II instruction and goals for student growth
- Review of MOY Acadience Data and growth goals
 - Increase of nearly 5% typical or better progress over MOY from last year
 - 8.9% additional needed to meet the EOY goal for this year
 - Mrs. Lawson described how data is used to identify and meet the needs of individual students
 - All teachers on a team are aware of the individual students and their needs
 - Discussion of end of year testing schedules
- Lisa Smith- Review of Board Training
 - Other schools have used Land Trust money for Walk to Math, Dual Language Immersion, cultural activities to promote diversity and inclusion, school counselor/full time psychologist
 - Jenifer Lawson is going to follow up with a school doing Walk to Math to get more information about that
 - Discussion of the benefits of math interventions/enrichment
- Safe Walking Routes Discussion
 - Brief overview of PPT from Herriman City
 - Safe Walking Routes are a collaboration between the city and school district
 - Overview of Safe Walking Routes and maps linked on our school website
 - Spanish translation will be added to the routes/maps for next year
 - We need more information from Herriman City before all routes can be updated
 - Discussion of areas of concern

- Intersection of Sentinel Ridge and Lower Meadow is an issue-Melinda has helped students cross on numerous occasions, students cross here even though it isn't part of the safe walking route
 - This intersection needs a light, flags, flashing crossing, or something to address the issues
 - Northeast side of Area 10- parents are concerned about the students in the walking area and the roads they need to cross to get to school
 - Mountain Ridge and Ridge View get out at the same time on Fridays. This is an item of a discussion with the district.
 - Discussion of daily schedule
 - SCC members would support an earlier start time and discussed benefits of this:
 - Many students arriving at school early already
 - Bused students are getting home very late
 - Elementary students are starting much later than middle and high school siblings
 - Discussion about 6th Grade and K-3/4-6 schools
 - 6th grade is staying at Ridge View for the 2023-2024 school year
 - More information to come- building should be ready for the 2024-2025 school year
 - Discussion of School Safety
 - Drills every month alternating between different emergency scenarios
 - Review of different types of drills and what they are used for
 - Reunification plan overview, Mountain Ridge is our alternate location
 - We have regular safety assessments from the district
